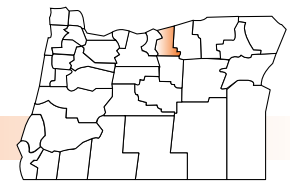

## STATUS OF OREGON'S CHILDREN 2008

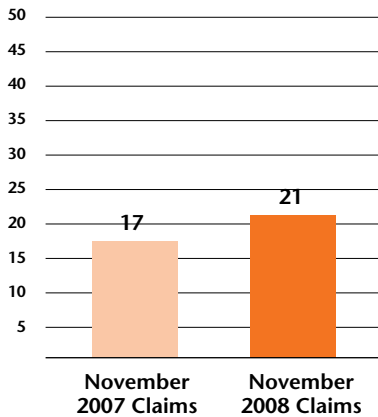

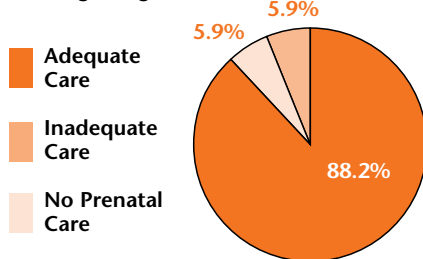
### Unemployment Claims

### Prenatal Care

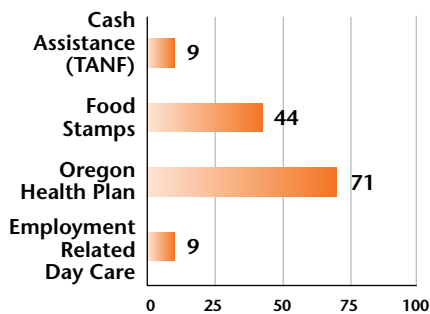
Percent of mothers who received prenatal care beginning in their first trimester.

### FAMILY FINANCES & STABILITY

\$50,200 is the median family income, which is 14% lower than the state median. 0.59 per 1,000 people filed for personal bankruptcy in 2007, a 79% decrease since 2006. Data unavailable for the percentage of subprime loans in this county. 39.2% of public school children are eligible to receive free/reduced price lunches during the school year. On average, 76 children eat free/reduced price lunches during the school year, while only no children receive free lunches during the summer.

### CHILD WELFARE

18 children were victims of child abuse/neglect (44.9 per 1,000 children) 56% of victims of abuse/neglect were under age 6. 17 children in the county have been in foster care at least once during the past year. 50 reports of child abuse/neglect were made in this area in 2007. 92% of these reports were assessed, and 38% were founded.

### CHILD HEALTH

56.9% of eighth graders did not have a medical check-up or physical exam in the previous year. No children have access to School-Based Health Centers in their schools in this county. There are no full-time school nurses in this county. The preferred ratio is 750 students to 1.0 FTE nurse. 23.5% of mothers have reported using tobacco during pregnancy. 8.9% of eighth graders reported smoking cigarettes in the previous month.
