



**Status of Oregon's Children
County Data Book 2008
*Helping Oregon Families in a Tough Economy***

Key Findings - Washington County

Family Finances and Stability

- \$67,500 is the median family income, which is 15% higher than the state median.
- 37,550 children live in low-income households (200% of the federal poverty level, or \$41,300 for a family of four in 2007).
- Unemployment claims have increased 77% between November 2007 and November 2008.
- Subprime loans make up 22.4% of loans in this county.
- 2,970 families receive cash assistance through the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program.
- 2,169 families receive child care subsidies through the Employment Related Day Care (ERDC) program.

Child Health

- 15,152 children (11.0%) have no health insurance.
- There are 8,310 students for every 1.0 FTE school nurse in this county. The preferred ratio is 750 students to 1.0 FTE nurse.
- 85.7% of mothers received adequate prenatal care.

Child Welfare

- 882 children were victims of child abuse/neglect (6.4 per 1,000 children).
- 1,426 children in the county have been in foster care at least once during the past year.
- 26,095 reports of child abuse/neglect were made in 2007. 42% of these reports were assessed, and 10% were founded.
