



**Status of Oregon's Children
County Data Book 2008
*Helping Oregon Families in a Tough Economy***

Key Findings - Yamhill County

Family Finances and Stability

- \$67,100 is the median family income, which is 14% higher than the state median.
- 8,362 children live in low-income households (200% of the federal poverty level, or \$41,300 for a family of four in 2007).
- Unemployment claims have increased 53% between November 2007 and November 2008.
- Subprime loans make up 27.3% of loans in this county.
- 914 families receive cash assistance through the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program.
- 489 families receive child care subsidies through the Employment Related Day Care (ERDC) program.

Child Health

- 2,449 children (11.0%) have no health insurance.
- There are 3,401 students for every 1.0 FTE school nurse in this county. The preferred ratio is 750 students to 1.0 FTE nurse.
- 82.4% of mothers received adequate prenatal care.

Child Welfare

- 207 children were victims of child abuse/neglect (9.3 per 1,000 children).
- 199 children in the county have been in foster care at least once during the past year.
- 9,156 reports of child abuse/neglect were made in 2007. 38% of these reports were assessed, and 12% were founded.
