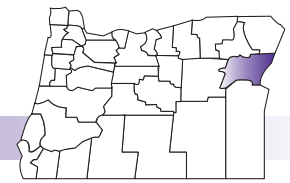

STATUS OF OREGON'S CHILDREN 2009

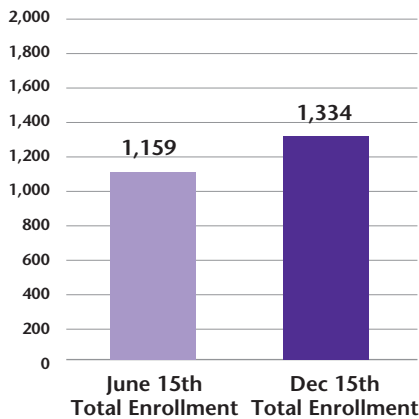

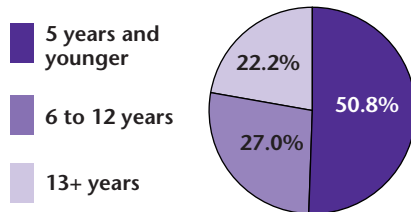
Healthy Kids

Victims by Age

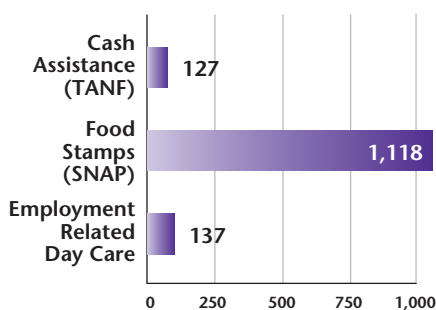
Founded abuse/neglect/threat of harm victims in foster care grouped by age (2008).

FAMILY FINANCES & STABILITY

\$50,000 is the median family income, which is 23% lower than the state median. 1.75 per 1,000 people filed for personal bankruptcy in 2008, a 14% decrease since 2006.

54.2% of public school children are eligible to receive free/reduced price lunches during the school year. On average, 780 children eat free/reduced price lunches on a given day, while no children receive free lunches during the summer.

CHILD WELFARE

307 reports of child abuse/neglect/threat of harm were made in this area in 2008.

51% of these reports were assessed, and 15% were founded.*

54 children in the county have been in foster care at least once during the past year.

52.2% of founded abuse/neglect/threat of harm referrals were related to domestic violence and 50.0% were related to substance abuse.

33.3 of children in out-of-home placement were living with relatives.

An unknown number of youth aged out of foster care.

CHILD HEALTH

50.6% of eighth graders did not have a medical check-up or physical exam in the previous year.

1 School-Based Health Center is certified and operating in this county.

11 Newborns were low-birthweight.
