

## VOTE 2000

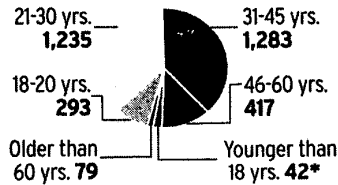
Oregon voters this fall face the most crowded ballot since 1914, with 26 statewide measures rounding out a slate of races for Congress, state offices and the Legislature.

#### ◆ Convictions in Measure 11 crimes:

Measure 11 took effect April 1, 1995. Here's a breakdown by age of 3,349 convictions statewide as of Sept. 1, 2000:



\* As of Sept. 1, 42 people younger than 18 were serving time in Oregon correctional facilities on Measure 11 sentences. Since Measure 11 went into effect, however, a total of 362 youths have been imprisoned for Measure 11 crimes before they turned 18.
