### Intel gift helps OMSI renovation

Intel has donated \$150,000 to the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry to help it match money from a National Science Foundation grant.

The National Science Foundation grant is \$1.8 million, slightly more than half of the money necessary to renovate Tech Hall and OMSI's Lab. Intel's money brings its recent OMSI donation total toward the renovation project to \$450,000.

### Other donations . . .

◆ **Children First for Oregon** received two grants to benefit its children's advocacy programs.

The agency received a \$20,000 grant from the **William G. Gilmore Fund of the Oregon Community Foundation** and a \$5,000 grant from **Portland General Electric** for sponsorship of the 2002 Report Card on the status of children in Oregon.

◆ Organizers of the **Columbia River Bank Cascade Cycling Classic** in Central Oregon donated \$3,000 to the **Bicycle Transportation Alliance** to benefit the group's bicycle safety program for

fifth- and sixth-grade students in Bend and Redmond.

◆ The **Oregon Community Foundation** gave \$10,000 to **Metropolitan Family Service** to support a mentoring project serving 200 youths in Washington County.

◆ **Community Vision** received \$18,000 from several companies and **Street of Dreams'** "Midsummer's Night Dream" fundraiser for its home ownership program. **Washington Mutual's** \$5,000 was the largest donation.

◆ The **Portland Teachers Credit Union** made a \$5,000 donation to help the **Portland Housing Center's** affordable housing programs.

◆ The **School and Community Reuse Action Project (SCRAP)** of North Portland received a three-year, \$6,000 grant from the **Jackson Foundation** to help build organizational capacity.
