**JESUIT HIGH ASSIGNS NEW BOARD MEMBERS AND OFFICERS . . .** Jesuit High School named a new chair and three new members to its board of trustees who will serve from July 2002 through June 2005.

They are Greg Specht, James Rudd, Mary Boyle and Andrew Ferguson.

Greg Specht is president of Specht Development and the new chair of the board through June 2004. His step-daughter, Whitney Bowles, graduated from Jesuit in 2001.

Andrew Ferguson is a Jesuit alumnus and chief executive officer for SRC Software. His volunteer work at Jesuit includes serving on the President's Alumni Advisory board and being a past president of the JHS Alumni Council.

He is also active in the campus ministry program and the annual alumni food drive. Ferguson has two brothers who are also Jesuit graduates.

Mary Boyle is a Jesuit parent and one of the chairs of the 2003 Jesuit High School auction. She is also a University of Portland regent, a board member for Children First, a mentor for St. Mary's Home for Boys and a fund-raiser for the YWCA.
